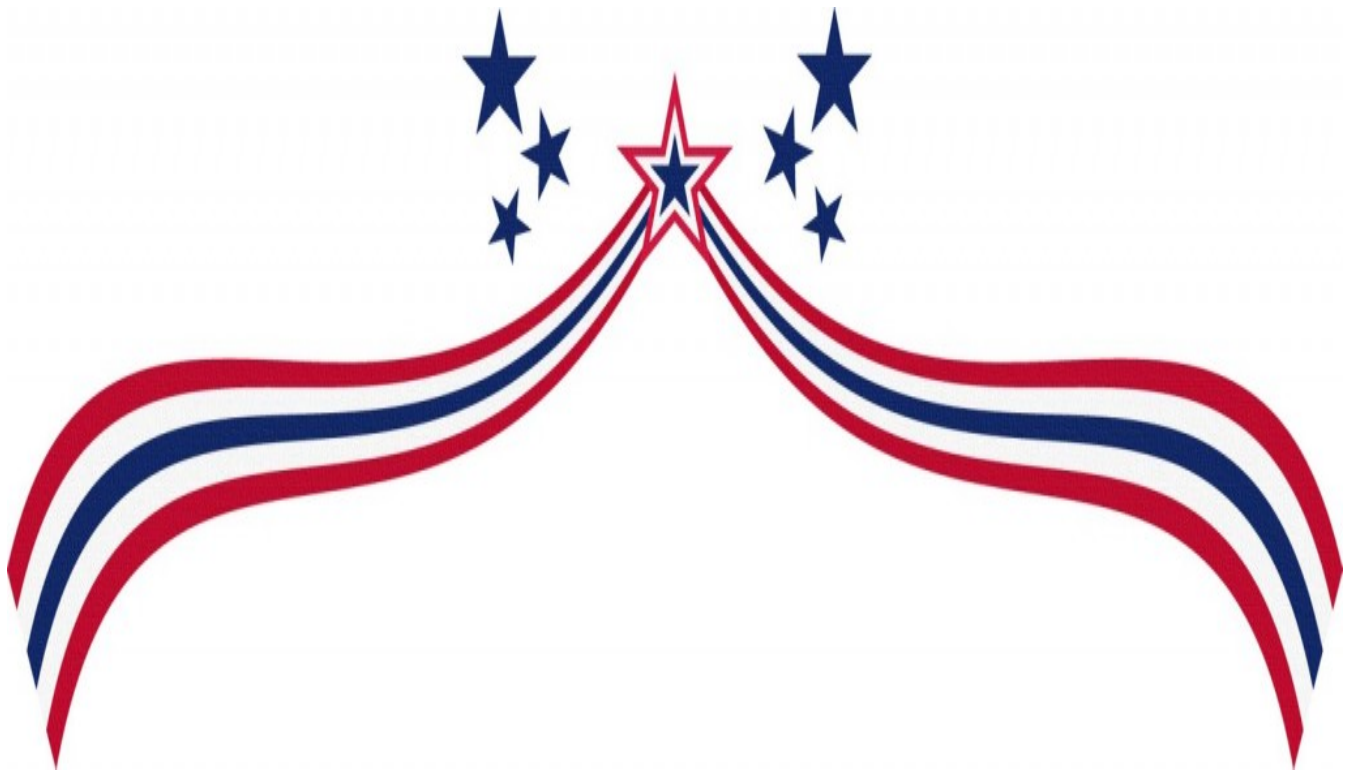
GENERAL RULES

Please also read the rules in each Division

1. This Flower Show conforms to the standards established by National Garden Clubs, Inc. (NGC). The *Handbook for Flower Shows* 2017 Edition, Revised July 2020, July 2021, July 2022, July 2023. The handbook is online at: <https://gardenclub.org/flower-show-school-resources>. The NGC Website is the authority for all issues not covered by the schedule, which is “The Law of the Show.”
2. The show is open to any amateur, providing he/she adheres to the schedule requirements. Each exhibitor is limited to one (1) entry per class, except the Horticulture Division.
3. Advanced registration is required for all Design Classes. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to read and understand the flower show rules. Questions should be addressed to the Flower Show Chairman or Design Entry Chairman. Once a reservation is made it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to fill that reservation or furnish a substitute for the exhibit, with prior notice and approval by the appropriate division chairperson.
4. For Horticulture, exhibitors are encouraged to fill out entry cards in advance in pencil.
5. Entry cards for Horticulture are available from the Entries Chairmen or from the General Chairman in advance or will be available at the prep room door.
6. Entries will be received Thursday, May 16, 2024 from 2:00 to 5:00 pm, and Friday, May 17, 2024, from 7:00 to 9:30 am. No entries will be accepted after 9:30 am on Friday.
7. Entries must be removed on Saturday, May 18, 2024, between 4:00 and 5:00 pm.
8. Judging will take place between 10:00 am and 12:00 pm on Friday, May 17, 2024. The flower show will be open to the public from 1:00 to 4:00 pm on Friday, May 17, 2024 and 10:00 am to 4:00 pm Saturday, May 18, 2024.
9. The Classification Chairman for each Division checks exhibits for conformity to the schedule prior to judging, and initials entry cards to signify approval. Final determination for conformance is the judges’ responsibility (HB pg.24).
10. The General Chairman and the Classification Chairman for each division are available during judging for possible consultation. They, along with the judges and clerks, are the only personnel allowed on the floor during judging (HB pg.25).



11. Awards will be given according to the NGC Standard System of Awards. The decision of the judges is final. Awards may be withheld if not merited (HB pg. 25). An accredited judge must sign and date each blue ribbon, 90+ and Top Exhibitor Award ribbon.
12. There must be emphasis on FRESH plant material; no artificial plant material is permitted in any exhibit in any Division (HB pg.25).
13. All properties must be marked with the exhibitor's name. The show committee will strive to assure the safety of all items after arrival and placement but, is not responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits.
14. The NGC Handbook and this schedule do not allow the use of plants listed on the Invasive Plant List and the Conservation List in the Design and Horticulture Divisions. See page 17 of this Schedule.
15. Exhibitors are responsible for space reserved. If unable to exhibit, the exhibitor must provide a substitute for the exhibit with prior notice and approval of the Division Entries Chairman.



THE NGC STANDARD SYSTEM OF AWARDING

The NGC standard system of awarding (HB pg. 25) is used in all divisions.

Blue ribbon - 1st place - Only one per class/sub-class; must score 90 points or more.

Red ribbon - 2nd place - Only one per class/sub-class; must score 85 points or more.

Yellow ribbon - 3rd place - Only one per class/sub-class; must score 80 points or more.

White ribbon - Honorable Mention; one or more as merited; must score 75 points or more.

All 90+ exhibits shall be so noted, entry cards signed and dated by an Accredited Judge.

National Garden Clubs, Inc. (NGC) Top Exhibitor Award ribbons may be given to Blue Ribbon Winners in designated classes which meet the following requirements: Horticulture, and Design must have been awarded blue ribbons, scoring at least 95 points or higher, and must have met other specific requirements of the Top Award Ribbon offered as stated in *Handbook* page 40. The correct botanical name is required for a Top Award Ribbon in Horticulture.

AWARDS

NGC TOP EXHIBITOR AWARDS

HORTICULTURE DIVISION I

Award of Horticultural Excellence (HB pg.40) (Rosette of green, blue, and orange ribbons)
Only one may be offered to the highest scoring 95+ blue ribbon exhibit in the Horticulture Division, provided that all general and horticulture rules and requirements are met. A plant must be identified by its binomial name or its currently accepted scientific identification to be eligible for any Top Exhibitor Award. Only Section Award winners, are eligible for consideration for this award



HORTICULTURE SECTION AWARDS

Award of Merit (HB pg.41) (Rosette of orange ribbons) may be awarded to a correctly named blue-ribbon winner scoring 95 or above in Division I, Sections A, B, C, D, and I. Five (5) Award of Merit Ribbons may be awarded in this flower show.

The NGC Arboreal Award (HB p 40) (Rosette of green ribbons) may be awarded to a correctly named blue ribbon winner scoring 95 or above in Division I, Sections E, F, G, and H. Four (4) Arboreal Awards may be given in this flower show.

DESIGN SECTION AWARD

Table Artistry Award (HB pg.43) (Rosette of burgundy Ribbons) may be awarded to a blue-ribbon winner scoring 95 or above. **One** award may be given for Division II, Section A, Classes 1,2, and 3. Minimum of 4 exhibits per class.



Horticulture Rules

Division I

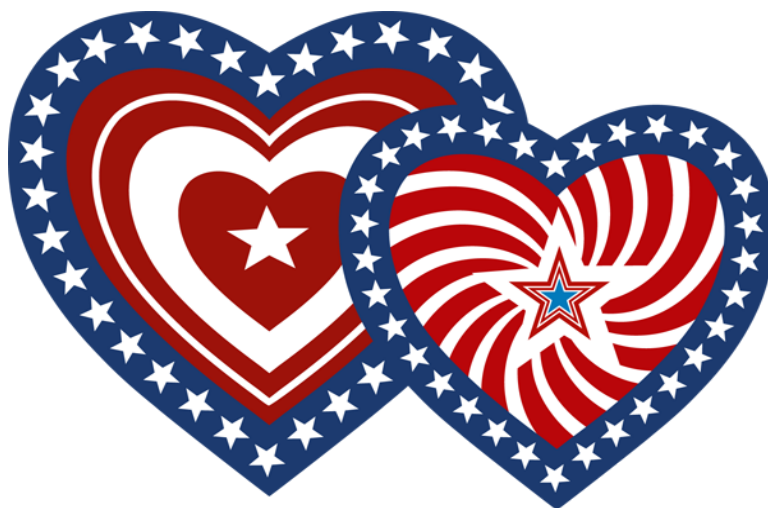
“God Bless America”

Eligible for Award of Horticulture Excellence

The NGC exhibit policies are printed in the *Handbook* page 55.

1. Horticulture entries will be received Thursday, May 16, 2024, from 2:00 to 5:00 pm and Friday, May 17, 2024 from 7:00 to 9:30 am. **No** horticulture will be placed at any other time or date. No late entries will be placed or judged.
2. Participation is open to all amateur growers. All entries must be **fresh** plant material grown by the exhibitor. All plant material must have been in the possession of the exhibitor the appropriate number of days (HB page 55).
3. Plant material must be in its natural state and may not be altered by application (treatment) of oil, commercial ‘shine’ products, etc., that change the natural appearance.
4. Only foliage and/or flowers naturally grown and still attached to the specimen are permitted in the flower Show. Unattached foliage is never included with a cut bloom specimen.
5. In order to receive an NGC Top Exhibitor Award, the exhibitor must identify his/her entry by its binomial name or currently accepted scientific designation HB page 40 IIA 3.
6. Entry cards are available from the Horticulture Entries Chairman, Claudia Green or from the General Chairman
7. Entry cards are to be filled out in advance if possible, written in pencil. To correctly fill out an entry card see HB page 27.
8. Entries are first accepted by the Horticulture Classification Committee to insure proper identification. All entries will be placed by a Placement Committee member only.

9. Cut specimens must be displayed in a clear, transparent, glass bottles, supplied by the exhibitor. No plastic bottles may be utilized. Cut specimens should not have foliage below the water line except for *Gladiolus*.
10. Wedging (a food-grade plastic wrap in the neck of the container to improve pose of the specimen) is encouraged and is supplied by the show committee.
11. The Horticulture Classification Committee Chairman and/or General Show Chairman are free to subdivide classes by color, form, size, cultivar, variety, or other distinguishing characteristics (HB pgs.3-4).
12. Exhibitors may make more than one entry per class if each entry is a different species, variety, cultivar, type, or color.
13. The rules for single species, cut or container-grown specimens are listed in the *Handbook* page 27.
14. If a plant is considered a flowering plant, it should be exhibited as a flowering specimen. Foliage plants may flower but, should be exhibited as foliage plants if they are grown for their leaves.
15. Specimens with a class designation in the schedule may not be entered in the 'Any Other Worthy' class.
16. The Scales of Points for Horticulture are located in the *Handbook* pages 129 - 130.

Design Rules

Division II – Design “National Anthem”

1. Any NGC member may enter a design in the flower show if all schedule requirements are met. Advanced registration is required for all design entries with the Design Entries Chairman, Martha Wolf (603-496-6001) by April 20, 2024.
2. This Flower Show conforms to the standards established by National Garden Clubs, Inc. (NGC) and the *Handbook* which is the Law of the Show.
3. The NGC exhibit policies and guidelines are printed in the *Handbook* page 28.
4. Exhibitor may enter multiple classes and guidelines are within the design division, but only one (1) exhibit per class.
5. Each exhibit must be the work of only one (1) exhibitor and the exhibitor’s name must appear on the entry card.
6. Design entries will be received Thursday May 16, 2024, from 2:00 to 5:00 pm, and on Friday, May 17, 2024 from 7:00 to 9:30am. No entries will be accepted after this time.
7. All designs must be removed by the exhibitor Saturday, May 18, 2024 between 4:00 and 5:00 pm.
8. All plant material used in the design must be identified on a 3” x 5” card, provided by the exhibitor and included with the entry card. Botanical and/or common names are acceptable. Plant material need not have been grown by the exhibitor.
9. **Fresh** plant material is emphasized and may not be treated in any manner. Dried plant material may be treated.
10. The designer, where required, must furnish staging panels, underlays and overlays.
11. Exhibitors are responsible for keeping their designs in good condition for the duration of the show.
12. If the designer is unable to fulfill the assignment, it is the designer’s responsibility to provide a substitute, and notify the Design Entries Chairman.



- 13.If a designer is unable to transport and/or set up his/her completed design, a substitute person may enter the exhibit for the designer. The designer may receive exhibiting credit if needed (permitted only for completed design)
- 14.Artificial flowers, fruits, vegetables, and foliage are prohibited. Landscapes or scenes are prohibited. (HB pp 80 - 81) No cut fruits, vegetables, or prepared foods are allowed.
- 15.For things permitted in all design classes unless prohibited by the schedule see the *Handbook* pp 80 - 81.
- 16.The exhibitor is required to conform to the stated descriptions and limitations of the design type if named in the class (HB pg.29).
- 17.Designer is on his/her honor that the design being entered has not been previously entered or judged in a NGC Standard Flower Show (HB pg.137).
- 18.The use of any part or parts of plants, on the South Carolina Conservation and Invasive Plant list are prohibited. See pages 17-19 in this schedule.
- 19.The committee will endeavor to protect all designs but cannot be responsible for loss or damage to the designer's property.
- 20.Rules for design types, advanced design types, table designs and table appointments are printed in the *Handbook* page29.
- 21.Rules for Design Types, Advanced Design Types, Table Designs and Table Appointments are printed in the *Handbook* page 73-79.
- 22.The American flag is not permitted to be used within a design.
- 23..Designer is on his/her honor that the design being entered has not been previously entered or judged in an NGC Flower Show.
- 24.Plant material and non-plant material permitted and not permitted in the Design Division are printed in the *Handbook* pages 80-81.
- 25..The Scales of Points for Designs are listed in the *Handbook* page 130.



Division II -Design “National Anthem”

Section A. “The Star Spangled Banner” Table Designs Table Artistry Award

Designs in this section will be Table Designs. (HB pgs. 76-77) Designs must relate to the service of food. **No food is permitted.** No serving utensils or flatware is to be used. The designer has complete freedom to choose plant material, fresh and/or dried.

Class 1 “Dawn’s Early Light “

4 entries

Functional Tray for one (HB p 76) staged on a wooden tray (medium oak stain finish) 14 3/4”w X 11”d with 1 1/2” lip and black iron handles furnished by the show committee. Trays will be staged on 8’ table covered with white tablecloths. A decorative unit (floral design) must be included, stable and in proportion to the one(1) place setting.

Class 2 “Rocket’s Red Glare”

4 entries

Functional Table for two (HB p 76) staged on standard card table 32” X 32” draped with a white cloth provided by the show committee. The decorative unit must be proportional to the table. Overlays are encouraged. Viewed from all sides but judged from the front.

Class 3 Twilight’s Last Gleaming”

4 entries

Exhibition Table (HB p 76) Creative Design not meant to be functional. Staged on 7’ tables covered in white tablecloths. Design space is 34”w X 30” d X 48’ h. Designers must furnish an underlay, 34”w X 30”d and a staging panel 34”w X 48”h. The staging panel may be incorporated. Battery operated lights or candles are optional. A decorative unit is required.
